

The 2011 Utility Notice is for the annual Water, Sewer and Refuse collection user fees for the period January to December 2011. If these services are not offered to you by the municipality, you do not pay for them. In the past, Utility Fees were included with Property Taxes. Beginning in 2011, these fees will NOT be included on the Property Tax notice and are billed separately.

Any outstanding amounts after 4:30pm on July 4, 2011 will receive a 10% penalty. Any outstanding amounts after December 31, 2011 will become taxes in arrears and accrue daily interest charges.

Options available to pay your Utility Notice:

Pay By Mail

Mail a post dated cheque dated July 4, 2011. Payments must be received in the office before 4:30 pm on July 4th to avoid a 10% penalty. POST MARKS are NOT acceptable. Make the cheque payable to the District of Lillooet and mail it to District of Lillooet, Box 610, Lillooet, BC V0K 1V0.

Pay in Person

Bring your payment and, if applicable, your completed senior discount form (see below), to the Municipal Hall at 615 Main Street.

Pay by PC Banking /Phone

We are listed as "Lillooet, District of ". The account number is located in a box on the right on the Utility Notice. Online banking requires an eleven digit account number and to start with number 54. Add the number 54 and the first 9 digits of the account number.

For example: If your account no is 00000999-0, enter 5400000999

We do not accept over the counter payments from financial institutions. If you make a payment at your financial institution, ensure that it is completed ON LINE and payment is confirmed.

Direct Withdrawal from your bank account from our Virtual Municipality

Go to our website www.lillooetbc.ca and select Virtual Municipality. If you are a first time user, please register and follow the prompts. You will require your online access code which is printed on the top right hand corner of this notice.

Ensure the payment transaction is confirmed by checking your bank records.

Prepayments

If you are currently on the Utility Prepayment Plan, your prepaid amount has been deducted from the total amount due. You will receive a renewal letter in August stating the 2012 monthly prepayment amount for utilities. Utility fees must be paid in full to continue with the prepayment plan. The monthly payments will remain separate for utilities and taxes as in 2011.

Mortgage Company Pays Taxes

If your mortgage company currently pays your Property Taxes, you may wish to advise them that Utilities will not be included in the 2011 Property Taxes. Mortgage companies may not pay Utility Fees if they are billed separately.
