

**DISTRICT OF LILLOOET
MAIL BALLOT VOTING INFORMATION
2012 By-Election**

General Voting for the District of Lillooet By-Election to elect a Mayor and one Councillor for the remainder of the 3 year term ending December 2014, will be held on Saturday, March 17, 2012, from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm at the District of Lillooet Municipal Hall. Advance Voting will be held on Wednesday, March 7, 2012, from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm at the District of Lillooet R.E.C. Centre, Room 201.

1. WHO CAN VOTE BY MAIL?

Electors may vote by mail if they:

- have a physical disability, illness or injury that affects their ability to vote at another voting opportunity, OR
- expect to be absent from the District of Lillooet on general voting day and at the times of all advance voting opportunities.

2. WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO VOTE?

You are allowed to vote if you are:

- a resident elector (i.e., you live in the District of Lillooet OR
- a non-resident property elector (i.e., you live elsewhere in BC but you own property in the District of Lillooet).

You must meet **all** of the following requirements to vote:

1. You must be 18 years of age or older on general voting day (March 17, 2012).
2. You must be a Canadian citizen.
3. You must have been a resident of BC for at least 6 months immediately before you register to vote.
4. You must have
 - (a) been a resident of the District of Lillooet for at least 30 days immediately before you register to vote (for resident electors), OR
 - (b) owned property (land) in the District of Lillooet for at least 30 days immediately before you register to vote (for non-resident property electors).
5. You must not have been disqualified by law from voting.

3. HOW DO YOU REGISTER FOR A MAIL BALLOT PACKAGE?

You must register at the District of Lillooet Municipal Office between 9:00 a.m. on February 29, 2012 and 4:00 p.m. on March 15, 2012, by phone, fax, mail, email, or in person, by providing the following information

- Full name,
- Residential address,
- Address of the property in relation to which you are voting (for non-resident property electors),
- Method of delivery of your mail ballot package:
 - (a) pick up at District of Lillooet Municipal Office, OR
 - (b) regular letter mail through Canada Post to residential address, OR
 - (c) regular letter mail through Canada Post to an alternate address that you provide when requesting the ballot package,

Mail Ballot Packages will be mailed, or available for pick-up commencing on March 7, 2012. To be counted for the election your mail ballot must be received by the Chief Election Officer no later than 8:00 p.m. on March 17, 2012.
